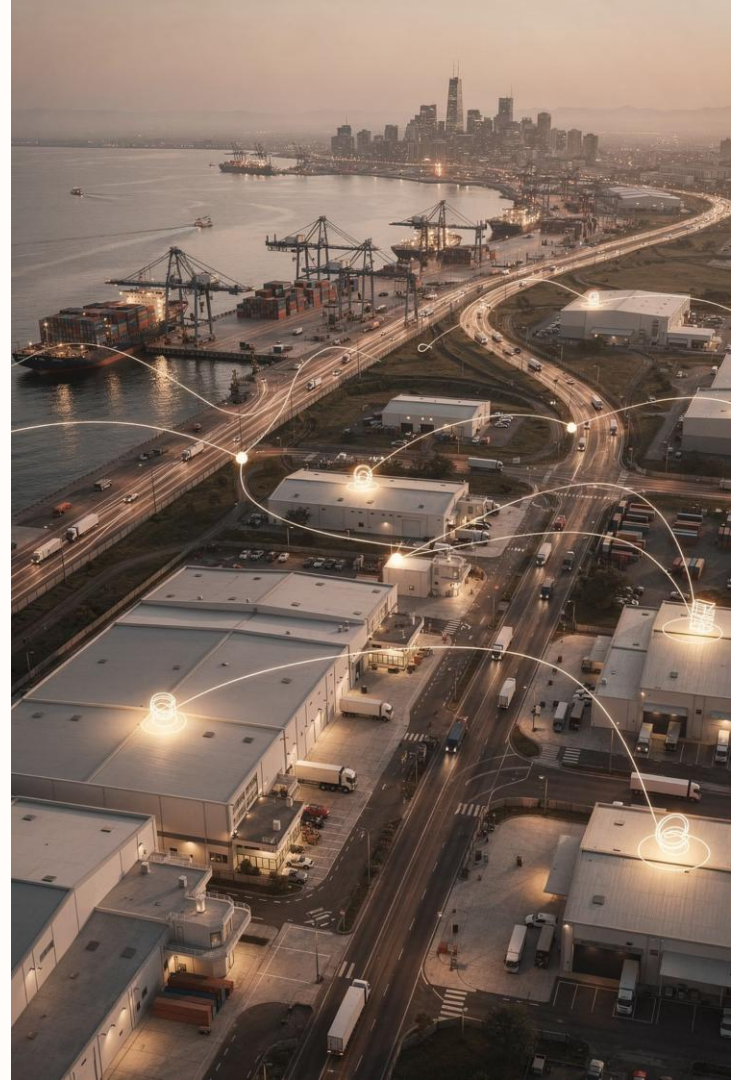

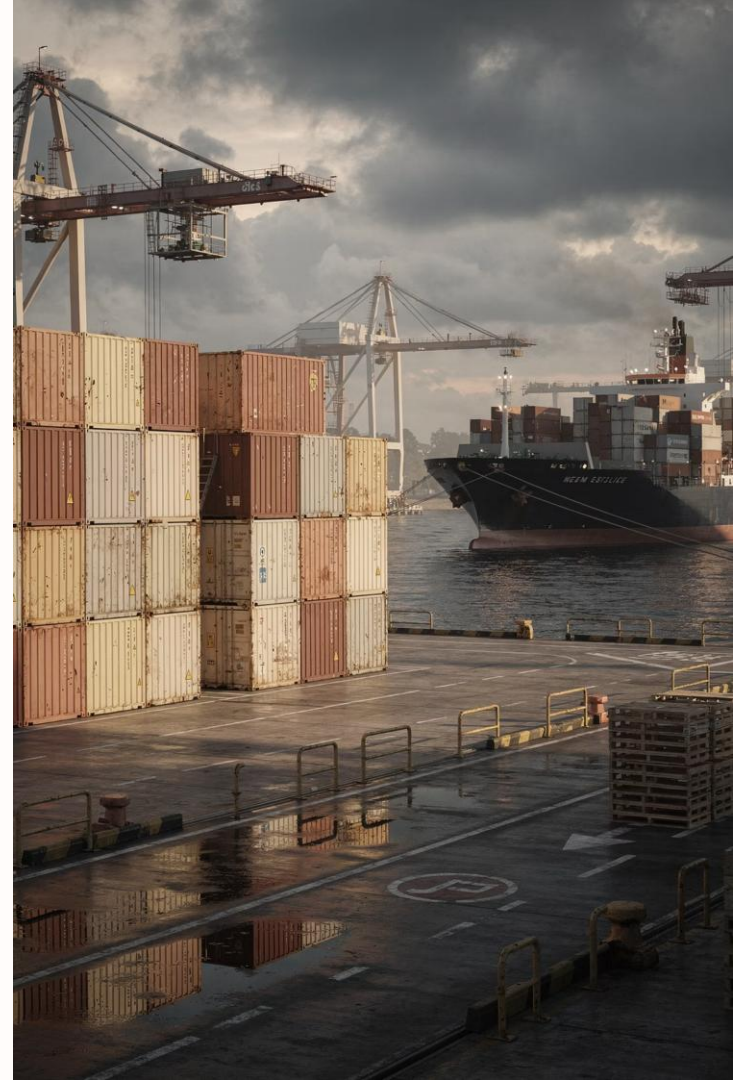

→ **Supplier Risk**

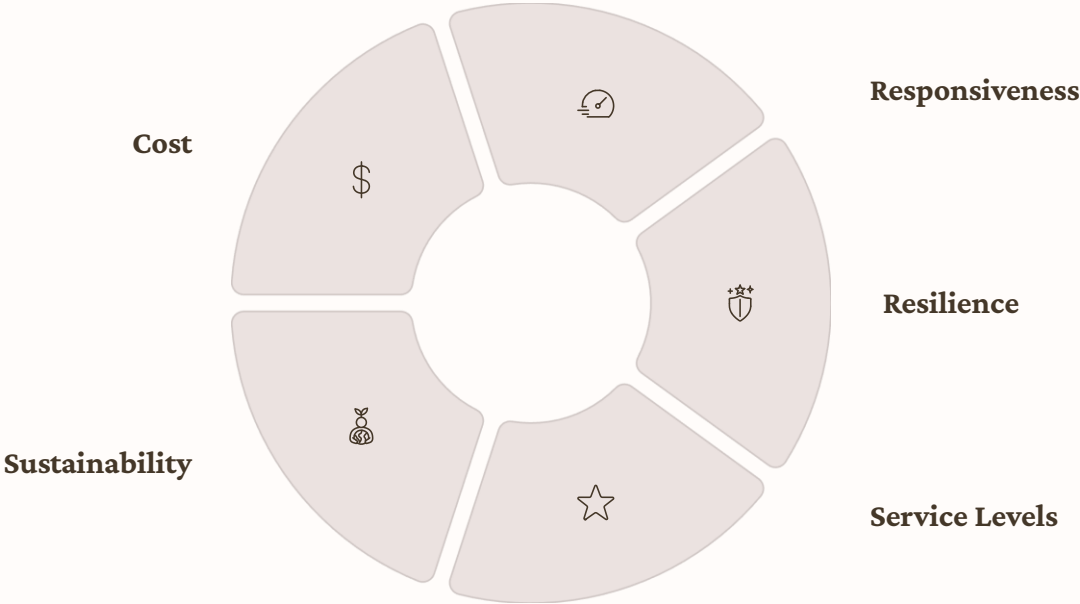
Choosing the lowest-cost supplier may increase geopolitical exposure
